Victorian Sampler

140 years on and a Victorian Sampler has returned to the old schoolroom where it was sewn.

A former pupil of Scruton Village School, Sarah Moss, sewed the sampler in 1877 when she was 12 years old. Sarah was born in Scruton in 1865 but eventually moved away, perhaps on marriage, died in 1918 and is buried in Sharow Churchyard near Ripon.

Her handiwork was returned to the village by Sarah's great-granddaughter Linda Walton.

In the fashion of the time, the sampler is an exercise in needlecraft and depicts biblical extracts, and alphabetic patterns.

It has been cleaned and reframed by SPC Chair Janet Crampton and was unveiled by our County Councillor Annabel Wilkinson.
