Notes from the last Parish Council Meeting

Village Green – it was agreed to consult Greensleeves to see whether further improvement to the quality of grass was needed. Constant shedding from the lime trees means there is always brash on the grass. Agreement was reached on which trees in the village needed pruning/attention.

Litter – as has been reported in the past, a lot of litter is being deposited in our lanes. We have made representations and it's gratifying to see that a lot has been cleared away. It's a perennial problem, however, with no easy answer as people seem unconcerned about the antisocial mess they create by abandoning rubbish.

Pot Holes – the state of Common Lane has been reported and it is noted that some work has been done on some of the holes. We have followed this up to urge that all of them are mended with a permanent fix rather than a seemingly half-hearted, half-executed attempt.

WWI Centenary Plans

Plans are shaping up for a range of activities over the next 9 or 10 months offering something for everyone.

It all starts on 31st March with an Afternoon Tea (see item above), and on 28th April an Evening Concert Party "Scruton's Got Talent". On 5th May we'll be witnessing the Tour de Yorkshire as it passes the village at the lane end, and on Thursday 7th June we're invited on a coach tour to the National Arboretum being organised by Anthony Wood (call him on 748301 if you're interested in going).

The Big Lunch is on 10th June with more information coming out soon. Saturday 16th June is the date of the Village Fete which this year will have an Edwardian Theme and there will be an Edwardian Garden Party on 22nd July at The Old Rectory.

On Saturday 28th July or 4th August (date to be decided but to be coinciding with the day war broke out in 1914) a Community Toddling/Walking/Jogging/Riding Challenge will be held involving anyone and everyone regardless of age to help us achieve a distance target – perhaps based on Scruton-to-the-Somme – with everyone contributing their bit whether a toddle round the playing field, a 4 mile walk or bike/horse-ride, or something even longer for keen riders and cyclists. Specially themed films in the autumn Screen Scruton programme, and a play about Thankful Villages will also be put on to entertain us; plus another Edwardian Christmas at Scruton Station and a whole weekend of activities to mark Remembrance Sunday weekend.
