# 1918-2018 Exhibition Call for Objects

As part of the programme of commemorative events planned for 2018, a small team is proposing to create a community exhibition of objects, photographs and stories relating to the First World War from families living in (or connected with) the parish of Scruton today.

It could be a photograph of a parent, grandparent or great-grandparent; a letter or postcard sent home; an object sent or brought home such as a piece of trench art (brass shell); an item of uniform such as a cap badge or shoulder title or something relating to the experiences of a family member on the home front. Equally, it could be a story, a snapshot of someone's war that brings one aspect of the conflict into focus.

It doesn't matter whether your family were living in Scruton during the First World War period or not – what is going to unite the objects we put together, is the fact that they will all highlight different aspects of the First World War, and indeed different theatres of war, collectively telling the whole story.

The exhibition will run over the course of a weekend during October or November in the village hall. Images of the objects loaned and their accompanying stories will then form part of a publication which will be one of several permanent legacies of the commemorations.

At this stage, please just start thinking about what your family might be able to contribute to the exhibition. We will be sending out a more detailed form in the early summer, on which we will ask you to tell us more about your object, photograph or story, identifying where more research may be needed and address practical considerations for display.

## Village Green

Trevor Howe has sent in the following, now slightly abridged .... "The Parish Council has been maintaining the Village Green since 1895. In the 1960s, the Parish Rate was doubled to £65 p.a. for two years in order to purchase a powerful hand-mower to keep the Green in good order. The Village Green was officially registered in 1969 and in the 1980s the major part of the Green was designated a Conservation Area. In 1982 Tony Hoare started cutting the Green with an old tractor and grass mower until about 2010. This kept costs very low for the Parish Council but the decision eventually came to hire in a contractor to undertake a specified number of cuts per year. Last year we had treatment given to the grass too.

In 1950 the Parish Council had to intervene to stop a local timber merchant from cutting down the trees on the green and has been vigilant in maintaining them ever since. Around 2010 a comprehensive tree survey was carried out and considerable work was required which included taking out the dead tops of the 15 Lime Trees, all of which date from the mid-19th Century and have Preservation Orders on them. We have continued with a rolling programme of careful and professional tree maintenance ever since and the condition of the trees is inspected monthly. Healthy trees lead to heavy leaf fall every autumn, and healthy trees are thirsty, taking water from the Green around them, but also provide an effective wind break and greatly enhance our village scene".
