We have all experienced some lovely open summer days recently, which suddenly came to an end the day after the equinox. There have been signs of autumn for some time: early morning mists, spiders and flies coming into houses to hibernate, tree leaves gradually turning colour, lots of fruits and ripe hedgerow berries. Most summer migrants have left to be replaced by birds such as curlew, lapwing and gulls, from their breeding grounds. In the next few weeks tawny owls become very active at dusk as they hoot to establish their winter territories. They are easily seen as they frequently call from roof tops and telegraph poles. Bats are still out feeding and Liz Lamb watched a young cat attempting to catch some as they flew around our court yard recently. Notes From the Parish Council

Boarding Restriction on the 54 Bus Service

Service 54 is supported by NYCC and has been operated by Hodgsons since 29 April 2019 (previously operated by Procters Coaches).

NYCC have confirmed that the boarding restriction is to ensure that Service 54 does not take passengers away from commercial Service 73 on the section of route between Leeming Bar/Morton-on-Swale/Northallerton. Service 73 runs half hourly and is operated on a wholly commercial basis by Procters Coaches (Dales & District). The Council could be challenged by the operator as it may undermine Service 73 by diverting passengers and this could result in the operator reducing the frequency or withdrawing the service.

Passengers from Scruton, the Fencotes and Kirkby Fleetham may board Service 54 from their usual bus stops and alight at any stop; you may also board at any stop for your return journey back to these villages.

The boarding restriction has always existed but was not relevant when both services were operated by the same company (Procters Coaches prior to 28 April 2019).

Representations to the Parish Council

The Parish Council has a legal requirement for all decisions to be reasonable and proportionate and there is a further requirement for a clear and transparent audit trail of all decisions reached. Therefore, it is respectfully requested that any matter for consideration by the PC is either raised at a PC meeting where it can be documented and recorded in the minutes by the Parish Clerk or raised in writing to the Parish Clerk. Please submit any correspondence at least 14 days before the Parish Council meeting (see panel below for dates).
