

### Parish Council Elections

As previously notified, all current places on the Parish Council are up for election this year and Chris Barron, Parish Clerk, has nomination papers.

There are five places on the Parish Council. Should there be more than five nominations, a full election will be held.

Several people have asked what is involved.

Being part of the Parish Council is not in itself an arduous time commitment - 6 ordinary evening and cyclical meetings a year (for instance including the AGM and the the village's Annual Parish Meeting, which the Parish Council convenes, and at which all the organisations in the village present their annual reports and accounts).

As a body, we are responsible for public places in the village, which involves rota'd inspections of the village green and public areas, as well as monitoring the condition of our village trees, for which we are liable and have an on-going maintenance plan.

These are minimum commitments. Being on the Council, however, also offers you the chance of being involved in Hambleton-wide as well as local village projects if you want to but there is no obligation to do so.

We are required to be conversant with and observe standing orders and financial regulations at all times. These will be provided electronically and in paper format for reference to all elected councillors. Training is offered regularly by the National Association of Local Councils to which we subscribe for advice from time to time.

It certainly helps to be computer literate as nearly all communications are done by email. The Parish Council is a statutory consultee on planning applications, and these come out in paper format.

An appeal is therefore sent out for people to put themselves forward and contact Chris Barron (contact details overleaf) for the nomination papers as soon as possible and NO LATER THAN 3rd APRIL 2019.

If you want any more information, please contact Chris or any of the current Parish Councillors.

We very much hope that some younger members of the community will step forward to represent the interests of families, but applications are welcome from anyone who wants to contribute to this aspect of village life.

### Church Electoral Roll 2019

A new Electoral Roll for St. Radegund's Church is due in 2019. Blank application forms for this will be in the Church (on the table by the door) from Sunday 10th March. If you wish to be included on the Electoral Roll you must fill in an application form and return it ASAP to Judi Elmer (Church Electoral Roll Officer) at the Old Rectory. If you are already included on the 2013 Electoral Roll and wish to remain, you will still need to complete a new form.

This has the benefit of being undercover and easier to use. We will be removing the one by the postbox.

The postbox itself may also be moved nearer to the bus shelter but this is something we have to negotiate with Royal Mail.
