Farming News

There is a feeling of spring everywhere. The dry, sunny days in late March have helped to get the spring barley sown and most of the lambs are outdoors and should be grazing the herbal leys and swedes in the coming days.

In late March I was notified that my cattle were within 3 km of an outbreak of Tuberculosis and that they would all have to be tested for the disease. Any that I sell will have to be tested again at my expense until further notice. I have questioned this and it turns out that only one of my fields is within the 3 km zone and this field has never been used for grazing cattle in my lifetime. I now must prove this to the authorities to be allowed to go back to the usual position of testing for this disease every 4 years.

Nature Notes

The warm weather has brought out cherry blossom and spring flowers, and thrushes and blackbirds are in full song especially at dusk. The first migrants have arrived - chiffchaffs with their repetitive and monotonous song and blackcaps which are truly melodious. Buzzards are performing spectacular mating displays, wheeling and diving whilst giving distinctive 'mewing' calls.



Red kites, which have been seen over the village, have narrower wings than buzzards and distinctive v-shaped tails, which they use as rudders, allowing great manoeuvrability with slow flight. Each year more are seen locally and I am sure they will start breeding soon. They were first released at Harewood House 23 years ago, and then in the Derwent Valley in 2004.

Look out for pink footed geese and whooper swans on their migration to Iceland and Greenland. By the end of April many of our summer migrants will arrive. Cuckoos, with geolocators, are flying north through west Africa after wintering in the Congo basin. They will arrive in England during April and May. Summer is not far away!

Solar Farms - We have received correspondence from Ecap Renewables requesting a preliminary meeting to discuss their plans for a new Solar Farm Development to the north of Fencedyke Lane. We will be meeting with them shortly and we will advise on the outcome in the next newsletter. We have not received any further communication from HDC about Lightrock's planning application and understand the delay is due to a backlog of planning applications from staff shortages during the Covid crisis.

Thank You - We would like to thank our County Councillor Annabel Wilkinson for all her help, advice and support over the past three years, in particular for her assistance with a financial contribution to the Playing Field draining scheme to alleviate the flooding in Ham Hall Lane. Annabel is standing again for the new County Council and we wish her success. We also thank our District Councillor Brian Phillips for all his help and advice.

Street Lighting - We will not be installing a new street light near the Village Hall as the lighting problem has been alleviated to a degree by pruning one of the trees adjacent to the street light outside the playing field. We have written to the Highways Agency over concerns about other poorly lit areas of the village and will keep you informed.

Parish Elections - Anyone wishing to stand for election to the Parish Council must have their completed nomination papers submitted by 4 o'clock on 5th April 2022. The current Councillors are all standing for re-election. If no further candidates come forward there will be no need for a parish election.
