### **Nature Notes**

Similar to last year, April's weather has been dominated by a cool northerly airstream, but without the devastating frosts. Consequently cherry and magnolia blossom, daffodils and tulips have been good and long lasting. Our first swallows arrived on the 13 April, closely followed by the odd house martin, blackcap and most unusually, a number of willow warblers which do not nest here but, after feeding for a few days, continue north. At the moment a pair of nuthatches are nesting in a hole in a plane tree on the village green. It is situated to the left of the notice board about twelve feet from the ground. The hole was originally about five inches in diameter but the birds have reduced it to roughly one and a half inches by blocking the entrance with mud, so only they can squeeze in.

Occasionally, unusual natural visitors are seen in the village. Peter Williams reminded me of the time he had complained of a heron taking his fish, then Caroline Byrne told him she had recently seen an otter go through his gate! More recently Stephen Elmer saw a young roe deer buck on the green near his garden gate.



At night foxes and hedgehogs are out and about in the village. Recent sightings include five little egrets, a kingfisher's nest and an osprey all near the island at the Swale. Look out for swifts and cuckoos. One cuckoo is already back in Scotland.

Historic RAF Aerial Photograph of Scruton from 1951



Whilst browsing the Internet recently, Joan Walker came across the above picture, taken by the RAF on 29 July 1951 (sortie 540/567, flown over Northallerton). It's one of over 400,000 historic aerial photographs that have been digitised and uploaded to Historic England's website. The photo shows Scruton prior to the developments at Meadow Drive, Meadow Court and The Parklands. Also visible is the now demolished Scruton Hall with its walled gardens surrounded by many trees.

### **Farming News**

A month ago, I had the feeling that I was starting to catch up with my work. The sun was shining and the land was drying out after winter. My greatest concern was the cattle movement restrictions brought on by bovine tuberculosis in a herd about two miles away; one of my arable fields fell into the restricted zone. Then on 6 April we tested positive for Covid, but because animals have to be fed, farm work still had to be done. Easter Sunday was the first day we could safely go out after 2 negative tests so we went for a coffee in the Dales. At this point I started to feel unwell. My lungs were on fire and I was certain that Covid had returned to bite me.

I drove home slowly and rested a couple of times before I finally got back. After calling 111 the medic asked "Did I have any Aspirin" and told me to crunch one up with my teeth and put it under my tongue. He suspected I was having a heart attack. The ambulance arrived almost immediately. I was taken to Darlington and after an hour in a corridor I was rushed to Cardiology and then 'blue lighted' to Middlesbrough. By 1 am on Monday morning I was in Theatre talking to the surgeon while he fitted a stent inside one of my main arteries. 20 minutes later I was heading for the recovery ward and home by Tuesday.

We wish Malcolm a speedy recovery.

New Council - Four current Councillors were returned unopposed to the Parish Council, there is therefore a vacancy for a Councillor. We can co-opt a new member, so if you fancy serving as a Parish Councillor please let the Clerk know in writing.

Solar Farm - ECAP Renewables cancelled the scheduled meeting with the PC about their proposed solar installation along the north side of Fence Dyke Lane at short notice because of connection issues; we are not sure if they will proceed with their plans. To date we have no further information on the progress of Lightrock's planning application. We have been informed that there is another planning application for a two hundred acre solar farm to the west of the A1 at Holtby/Langthorne.

Platinum Jubilee - Residents who would like a free jubilee mug (as advertised last month and on Network Scruton) for any young person in their household of 16 or under, should contact the Parish Clerk. A number of residents have expressed interest in buying a mug, the price is £6.

The Parish Council have agreed to pay for the fireworks at the Jubilee Beacon Lighting Party from the Community Fund. We hope everyone in the village will enjoy all the activities proposed to celebrate Her Majesty, the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. To date there have been no expressions of interest in planting a Jubilee tree so we will not be pursuing this initiative.

# Scruton Parish Council Chairman's Annual Report

Annual Parish Meeting, 14 April 2022



## **Chairman's Annual Report**

The restructuring of Local Government has meant the current Parish Councillors are required to stand for re-election, we have served three years to date, the next Parish Council will serve for five years thereafter the term in office will revert to four years.

The main event of the year was our objection to the Solar planning application from Lightrock. We canvassed the villagers and received 68% against the scheme, following our initial letter of objection we have submitted a further three addendum's in objection to the planning application. At present we are unaware of the status of the planning application; we have asked but have not been told what the hold-up is, as far as we know the application is still pending.

We provided a new salt bin for the Pittfields area and topped up all the other salt bins, fortunately it has been a mild winter so far and very little salt was used.

The snicketts were top dressed with sharp sand to make them more user friendly, we are currently liaising with NYCC footpaths to establish who has responsibility for maintaining them. Councillor Howe and Gordon McQuillian have planted some bulbs and flowers along the edge and tidied them up. We have also requested NYCC footpaths to address issues on the other village footpaths.

The large willow tree had to be cut down due to disease and two smaller hawthorn trees which died were felled, the remaining trees owned by SPC appear to be healthy. We can apply for a new tree to

be planted as part of the national tree planting scheme to celebrate Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee, we asked if the village wanted to take part but to date have received no support for this.

We were asked to explore the possibility of creating a footpath from Scruton Station to the A684, we undertook a feasibility study and sought support from the village but only eight residents responded supporting the initiative. Given the projected cost involved the idea has been put on hold, if we get given a lot of money it can be revisited.

The flooding issue in Ham Hall Lane has been resolved by a new drainage pipeline being laid from the Cricket Ground around the Tennis Court into the drainage beck.

We have implemented a Business Continuity Plan to our structure and are currently copying all our paper files for electric storage on the website.

We are looking to support a number of village functions to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty, the Queen, which will include a Jubilee mug for each child under 16 in the village.

I'd like to thank the Parish Clerk and my fellow Councillors for all the help and support during my time in the Chair. Hopefully the coming year will be better than last year and we can get back to a degree of normality following the Covid epidemic.
